Teaching learning Among students.

The methods used to promote teaching-learning process in the clinical settings are:

Teaching learning process in the clinical settings is done by case discussions / chair side teaching which is a time honoured and traditional way of teaching.

Newer investigating procedures help in the diagnosis of the cases.

Students maintain log books of their teaching-learning activities and records of UG and PG log books are available in every department.

There is a structured mechanism for post graduate teaching-learning process. This institution follows the DCI norms regarding the structured mechanism for post graduate teaching-learning process.

Every year 31st May is observed as World No Tobacco Day and the institution holds an oral and dental health exhibition which is open for the public for one week. For this, each department displays the exhibition of its preventive and treatment modalities and here comes the role of creative ideas of students and interns who come out with very innovative models, display material, slogans, posters, rangoli etc to explain the ill effects of tobacco, increase awareness regarding cancerous and pre-cancerous lesions. Various models are prepared to educate the correct brushing and flossing methods for the public health education. Irregular teeth alignment of front teeth is as aesthetic problem. For the correction of such teeth various models are prepared by the department of orthodontics which helps the adolescence to improve their facial aesthetic. Oral Surgery department displays models of oral cancer & cyst, jaw fractures etc. Emergency management protocol in the form of cardio pulmonary resuscitation is also displayed and the training is given to the general public for

saving life of person. Creative models of newer technical advancements in the treatment modalities like lasers and implants are also exhibited to increase the awareness of the population.

NO Tobacco Day Programmes

Oral Cancer is responsible for over 2/3 of the deaths caused by the cancer in India. Tobacco in any form is known to be the primary cause for oral,lung and GIT cancer.31st May is observed as World No Tobacco Day to create awareness regarding the ill effects of using tobacco in any of its forms.

VYWS Dental College Amravati in the motivational presence of Hon. DrNitinDhande, President Vidarbha Youth Welfare Society, Amravati had organized a 3 day screening and awareness campaign, on the 31 st May,1st June and 3rd June, for the underprivileged sections of the society ,where tobacco chewing and smoking is prevalent. The beneficiaries were mainly Truck drivers, laborers and local residents of nearby slum areas.

The staff and interns examined the patients in the Dental Mobile Van of the institute at around 12 different areas of Amravati. Around 351were screened for tobacco related precancerous n cancerous lesions and were counselled regarding awareness of the deadly effects of tobacco and to discourage the use of tobacco for chewing or smoking.

No cases of oral cancer were recorded, however, 21 cases of OSMF,33 cases of leukoplakia and tobacco induced hyperkeratosis and 4 cases of smokers palate were diagnosed at the camp.

These Patients were counselled and referred to VYWS Dental college for further management.


IDA Amravati Branch, Rotary Club Of Amravati and JCI Centurion supported this social cause and helped to make this campaign reach the beneficiaries.
















